

## CONSETT JUNIOR SCHOOL – SPORTS PREMIUM

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteacher's to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for children in school.

Each school will receive £8,000 each year for the next two years. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. The money will be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability.

### **Purpose of the Funding**

All schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but there is freedom to choose how we do it. At Consett Junior School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

### **How we have used Sports Premium Money in the last Financial Year**

<b>EXPENDITURE</b>	<b>IMPACT ACROSS SCHOOL</b>
We bought into the Consett Academy package for sports and competitions. This provides sports coaching for pupils, CPD for staff and network meetings for PE subject leaders.  <b>Cost - £4000</b>	This increased the quality of PE teaching in school and helped to increase staff expertise. Children could try new sports not normally available in school. We entered several sports competitions and festivals which the children really enjoyed.
Transport to competitions and festivals. (This was reduced due to how close we are to Sports Centre and Consett Academy).  <b>Cost – Approximately £200</b>	Subsidising travel costs so we could enter competitions that were not local which meant more children could take part in these activities.
Purchase of Outside Activities to start a new Forest School so children could learn and enjoy the outside environment.  <b>Cost – Approximately £3000</b>	A member of staff trained as a Forest School Teacher and we purchased an outdoor metal shed to keep the equipment in. We purchased equipment and waterproof clothing for the children so they could enjoy this activity in all weather.
Purchase of new PE mats and trolleys .  <b>Cost – Approximately £1000</b>	Replacing old equipment and storage for PE activities.
